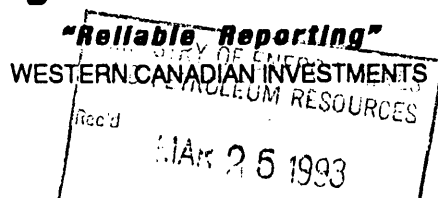

PACIFIC COMOX RESOURCES LTD. [PCM-V] LIB
MORE VISIBLE GOLD OBSERVED - Douglas R. MacQuarrie, chairman,
Pacific Comox Resources reports more visible gold was intersected in the current diamond drilling program at on the Harrison Gold project located 90 km east of Vancouver near Harrison Hot Springs, B.C. Drilling is currently at 1,095 feet in hole JN 93-148, with significant quartz veining - some containing coarse specks of visible gold and in particular, a rich vein at 1,014 feet. This interval is located about 1,000 feet from the high grade area, noted by Bema Gold in its previous drilling (33 feet of 0.33 oz.gold/ton). Gold mineralization throughout the first 1,000 feet of the Jenner zone is intimately associated with quartz-pyrrhotite-sericite-chlorite-carbonate veins.
A major structure was intersected at 1,070 feet followed by a highly silicified host cut by several typical gold-bearing quartz-pyrrhotite-carbonate-chlorite veins. Fractures in this section have been healed with quartz, chlorite, sericite and carbonate infilling with disseminated arsenopyrite. Drilling will continue to the planned 2,000 feet.
