BRONSON SLOPE DRILLING COMPLETED - Clifford A. Grandison,
president, reports

International Skyline Gold has completed drilling on the Bronson Slope area of its Iskut River property in northwest B.C. The holes were designed to test the extension possibilities of a higher grade gold/copper zone within the porphyry system. The following table lists significant drill intercepts.

It is expected the previously announced 112,000,000 ton resource of 0.019 oz.gold/ton, 0.14% copper and 0.10 oz.silver/ton will be increased. This resource contains 2,000,000 ounces of gold, 300 million pounds of copper and 11,000,000 ounces of silver. A recalculation of the mineral resource estimates is underway.

The company plans to use the new results together with previous data to define a mineable reserve and to design an initial high grade starter pit and a mine plan. The property is located close to hydro power and is 19 miles from the Eskay Creek mine access road. Infrastructure is now considered to be a significant impediment to mine development costs. A study of infrastructure costs and metallurgical studies will be used to prepare an economic evaluation.

Cominco Ltd. is exploring a portion of Skyline's property on behalf of the Snip Joint Venture, and has reported "that we intersected a zone of strong chlorite alteration from 69 to 116 meters in the fourth of five roughly 500 meters long holes we are drilling under our option agreement on your ground. Heavy pyrite occurs from about 87 to 90 meters and two adjoining 1.50-meter long samples were prepared which assayed 4.2 and 5.6 grams gold/tonne.

A steeper hole was drilled from the same setup and it encountered strong chlorite from about 100 to 152 meters in the hole. A zone of heavy pyrite 0.50 meters long occurs at 140 meters; it assayed only 0.40 grams gold/tonne. The zones of chlorite alteration in both holes were completely sampled but returned uninteresting values." Additional results are expected.
