B.C GOLD CLAIMS ACQUIRED - John Robertson, president, reports Teryl Resources Corp. has agreed to earn a 100% interest in the Mt. Sidney Williams gold property located 87 km northwest of Fort St. James, and 187 km northwest of Prince George, central B.C. Based on previous geophysical surveys which include VLF-EM, magnetometer and induced polarization surveys, several listwanite alteration zones in excess of 1,000 meters long and 50 meters wide have been outlined. Several coincident VLF conductors, chargeability and geochemical anomalies have also been outlined. A total of 17 listwanite zones have been located to date. Listwanite is a schistose rock composed of various combinations of quartz, dolomite, magnesite, talc and limonite. The best results from sampling are:

- 1) Upper Zone - mineralized over 2m with values up to 1.42 oz.gold/t
- 2) Stibnite Zone - mineralized over 3m with values up to .095 oz.gold/t
- 3) Zero South Zone - 2.5m of .46 oz.gold/ton, and
2.5m of .168 oz.gold/ton

Of 12 diamond drill holes completed to date, the best section reported 9.2m of 0.119 oz.gold/ton. A 1.0 meter interval within this section reported 0.433 oz.gold/ton. None of the holes completed to date have tested the geophysical anomalies adequately and several of the holes were drilled prior to the geophysical surveys. An

independent report on the Mt. Sidney Williams gold property suggests the possibility of an extensive low-grade, high-tonnage deposit.

Teryl can earn 100% interest, subject to a 2% NSR, by making \$210,000 in option payments and spending \$1,500,000 on exploration over five years. Work on the property will begin at the end of June and will consist of 10 diamond drill holes and soil sampling in promising areas. (SEE GCNL NO.70, 13Apr94, P.5 FOR OTHER PROJECT INFORMATION)

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
