B.C. DIAMONDS DISCOVERED - Robert J. Miller, D.Sc., P.Eng., vice president, exploration,

reports Consolidated Ramrod Gold Corp. has found diamonds and four new kimberlite pipes on its Ice property. SEE MAP OVERLEAF P.1. The 160.65 square km Ice property is located immediately west of the coal mining community of Elkford in southeastern B.C. The

property currently hosts six proven kimberlite occurrences. The 1994 work also provides evidence which suggests there are three or more undiscovered kimberlite bodies on the Ice claims. Small bulk samples were taken from each of the kimberlite pipes and sent to the following labs for testing: a) M.E. McCallum, Ph.D., Professor of Geology and Research Geologist, Colorado State University, for indicator mineral chemistry and diamond identification; b) Saskatchewan Research Council Lab (SRCL), for macro-micro diamond testing.

THE ICE KIMBERLITE PIPES: The Cross Kimberlite pipe is about 30 metres (99 feet) by 300 metres (990 feet) in plan as defined by

mapping and trenching. Indicator mineral chemistry as defined by McCallum shows G9 and G10 pyrope garnets.

The Ram 5 Kimberlite pipes has plan dimensions of 200 metres (660 feet) by 500 metres (1,650 feet) as defined by hand pitting. It will require drilling to verify these dimensions. One 800-pound sample was taken from near the centre of the pipe and showed one diamond of near gem quality about 2 mm is size. The SRCL sample was taken from near the west edge of the pipe, possibly a different phase, and did not show any diamonds greater than 0.25 mm in size.

Kimberlite pipes Ram 6, Ram 6.5 and Bonus have been surface sampled and samples sent to McCallum for indicator mineral chemistry and the Saskatchewan Research Council for macro-micro diamond testing. These results will be reported as soon as received. One clear, gem quality diamond fragment measuring 0.65 mm has been found in a sample from the Ram 6.5 pipe. The remainder of the diamond has not yet been discovered.

Ramrod owns 60% of 69.5 square km, the remainder is owned with undivided interest by WHITE KNIGHT RESOURCES LTD. [WKR-V] and BRIMSTONE GOLD CORP. [BSC-V] (formerly Gold Pac Investments Ltd.) Ramrod owns 100% of 69.4 square km. (SEE GCNL NO.222, 21NOV94, P.1 FOR OTHER PROJECT DATA)
