DAVE'S POND DRILL HOLE INTERSECTIONS BRANDYWINE PROJECT 70 KM NORTH OF VANCOUVER

DP93-4 CUT 74 FEET OF 0.22 OZ. GOLD/ TON Holes DP95-1 to 4 intercepted interesting mineralization, which ran 0.025, 0.03 and 0.075 oz.gold/ton.

DP95-5 CUT 30 FEET OF 0.64 OZ. GOLD/TON
DP95-6 CUT 27 FEET OF 0.69 OZ. GOLD/TON
DP95-7 HAS BEEN LOGGED WITH SOME MINERAL
DP95-8 HAS BEEN LOGGED WITH GOOD MINERAL
NO.95-9 PROPOSED TO BE DRILLED 50 FEET SW OF NO.95-8
NO.95-10 PROPOSED TO BE DRILLED 100 FEET SW OF NO.95-8

These holes listed above are interpreted to be defining a flat or sub-flat trough of disseminated mineralization near an intrusive complex with faults and cross faults and cut by a series of dykes. The trough is suggested to have a drilled northwest southeast strike length of 150 feet. Hole No.95-8, which has been logged as containing some good looking mineralization, suggests a possible 75-foot width to the trough or perhaps more likely a second mineralized structure.


The next two proposed holes DP95-9, DP-10 are currently planned to test the northwest possible extension of the trough.

The first holes drilled in the Dave's Pond zone in 1993 were interpreted to have found, as reported in GCNL No.153, 1, Aug. 11,1993, some high grade gold in a "flat-lying quartz sericite schist horizon with massive sulphides and visible gold." Wilson A. Gewargis, P.Geo., consultant to La Rock on the Brandywine project stated he favours the sub-flat trough interpretation of the complex geology. Other work on the Dave's Pond suggest vertical or erratic near-vertical gash veins. Mr. Gewargis said the next series of drill holes will assist in sorting out the trend of the mineral as well as the host formations etc.


The Brandywine property, located 30 miles north of Squamish, B.C. and two miles west of Highway 99, is 100%-owned by La Rock, subject to a 0.5% NSR.

Martial H. Levasseur, exploration manager, La Rock Mining Corp., reported in hole DP95-5 at 103 ft to 133 ft. a 30-foot weighted average equalled 0.64 oz. gold/ton. At 203 to 213 feet, a 10-foot weighted average = 0.24 oz. gold/ton. Hole DP95-6 was drilled 200 feet southeast of DP95-5. It appears the four holes, DP95-1 through DP95-4 were drilled too far to the northwest and over shot the mineralized zone. Drilling continues and assays are pending.
