CARIBOO DRILLING TO CONTINUE IN SPRING - Dorothy Dennis, president, Noble Metal Group Inc., reports drilling has been suspended due to extreme winter conditions at the 100%-owned J1 claim group located near the confluence of Snowshoe and Kefuney Creeks in the Cariboo Mining Division about 70 miles east of Williams Lake, B.C.

As reported earlier, diamond drill hole No.1 was designed to test the strike and dip of the mineralized zone. The hole was completed to a depth of 153 feet, 12 samples containing sulphide mineralization and quartz veinlets were cut and taken over an interval of the about 100 feet. Drill hole No.2 was completed to a depth of 351 feet of which a continuous section of 201 feet containing semi-massive sections of sulphide mineralization was cut and 33 samples taken. Diamond drill hole No.3, positioned to test Anomaly "C" was stopped at 171 feet due to weather. Thirty samples were taken over 122 feet. The mineralization consists of mainly of pyrite and pyrrhotite with chalcopyrite and hematite along the foliations. As the hole was being shut-down, blue quartz began to appear. The casing was left in the hole to enable re-entry to an anticipated depth of 600 to 1,000 feet. Completion of the program will resume in the Spring. All samples have been submitted for assay.
