LARGE GOLD ZONE DEFINED - Peter Tredger, vice president,

finance, North American Metals Corp, and Wheaton River Minerals Ltd. report drill results from their underground exploration program at the Golden Bear Mine 160 km south of Atlin, northwest B.C. SEE CROSS SECTION OVERLEAF P.3. The project is 100%-owned by North American Metals, an 81%-owned subsidiary of Wheaton River. Repadre Capital has a 2% NSR for the life of the mine. All holes into the Grizzly Zone to date have encountered gold mineralization showing an unusually high degree of continuity for this type of deposit. The mineralization occurs over a strike length of at least 400 metres and down a vertical dip of 200 metres. All drill intersections within the mineralized zone in order from south to north in the Grizzly Zone, including previous surface drilling are:

The 1992-93 holes were drilled from surface, while all the 1995 holes were drilled underground and are close to true width. The first four holes in the table are grouped at the south end of the deposit, while the remaining holes were drilled near the end of the decline. The deposit is open to the north and at depth. The companies plan to continue drilling until the end of February, at which time the program will be stopped for the season. Drilling on these zones will resume in June when the camp reopens to begin construction of the Kodiak heap leach mine. (SEE GCNL NO.227, 28Nov94, P.1 PREVIOUS PROJECT INFORMATION)
