BRANDYWINE DRILLING UNDERWAY - Dr. Robert Lee, president,
La Rock Mining Corp.,

reports a diamond drilling program is being conducted in the
McKenzie Zone of the 100%-owned Brandywine property, subject to
0.5% NSR, 30 km north of Squamish, BC. The purpose of the
program is to test coincident geophysical and soil geochemical
anomalies. The soil geochemical gold anomalous area covers about
100 hectares and has a strike length of more than 1,200 meters.

To date, two holes have tested a small portion of this anomaly.
Hole MC96-1 encountered predominantly sheared, silicified and
carbonized granodiorite containing inclusions of altered andesite, no
significant mineralization was intersected.

Hole MC96-2, situated 1,300 feet (400 m) east of MC96-1,
encountered massive pyrite bands and thinner pyritic laminations
within dacite tuffs. The sequence of felsic and intermediate volcanics
are favourably altered and intruded by granodiorite. The best
intersection assayed 0.325 oz.gold/ton (11.14 gms/tonne) gold and
1.36 oz.gold/ton (46.63 gms/tonne) silver across 2 feet (true width).
Results suggest the property has the potential for hosting a
volcanogenic massive sulphide type deposit. Presently, hole
MC96-3, situated 820 feet (250 m.) north of MC96-2, is testing the
northward extension of this anomalous trend. (SEE GCNL NO.60,
