KAMLOOPS SULPHIDES INTERSECTED - James Armstrong,
president of AFF
Automated Fast Foods Ltd., reports excellent sulphide mineralization
has been intersected over substantial width at the Chase Silica
property located near Kamloops, B.C., 40% optioned from
CHANDELEUR BAY PRODUCTION CO. LTD. [CYJ-V] for
100,000 shares and \$100,000 to be spent on exploration.

Diamond drill hole No. 96-1 recommended by Michael Skopus,
the company's consulting geologist, was drilled from the hanging
wall of the main silica quarry with a dip of -55° and an azimuth of
100° to test the mineral continuity at a depth of 500 feet below
previous diamond drill hole S-80-5. Hole S-80-5 returned values of
15.21 oz. silver/ton, 1.49% lead and 1.61% zinc over 1.8 metres
with additional silver, lead and zinc values over 1 0.2 metres.

Diamond drill hole 96-1 encountered a major quartz zone from
260 feet to 675 feet. The fault occurs from 497 feet to 614.5 feet
carrying excellent sulphides, ranging from 5% to 15% over a length
of 117.5 feet. The drill hole has been logged, sampled and the core
samples are currently being assayed by Chemex Laboratories for
gold, silver, lead, zinc and copper. Diamond drill hole 96-1 was
