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## INTERNATIONAL SKYLINE GOLD CORP.

DRILLING TO RESUME AT BRONSON SLOPE - C.A. Grandison,  
president.

International Skyline Gold has reported the start of a 5,000 foot drilling program on the Bronson Slope gold, copper porphyry deposit, 150 km north of Stewart, in northwest B.C. The Bronson Slope deposit is the subject of a feasibility study which was scheduled for completion in the spring of 1997. The report has been delayed in order to obtain additional results from metallurgical studies and to incorporate assay results from the proposed drilling program. The previously announced mineral resource is as follows:

The above mentioned mineral resource was calculated using a 75 metre search radius for measured and indicated resource and 100 metres for inferred resource with a cut-off of \$8.00 NSR per tonne. Net smelter return is the value of recoverable metal per tonne after deduction of transportation and smelter charges. The same geostatistical report included a potential resource using a less conservative search radius of 250 metres as follows:

The objective of the planned drilling program is to convert

these inferred resources into the measured and indicated resource category for mine planning purposes. Skyline has been successful in increasing the mineral resource in each of its recent drilling campaigns and expects to increase both the quality and quantity of its resource with this drilling program. Upon receipt of these results Skyline expects to complete an ore reserve estimate and a feasibility study by the end of summer 1997.

Skyline originally filed an application for a project approval certificate for the Bronson Slope project under the environmental assessment act on November 25, 1995. Skyline was notified on March 25, 1996 that it should proceed to the second review stage as provided under the act and it should prepare a project report. Since filing the application, Skyline has worked continuously in an effort to compile the required information and expects to complete the project report by late summer 1997.

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
