BC DRILLING UNDERWAY - Scott Angus, president, reports Mount
Hope Resources Corp. has begun
diamond drilling at the 100% owned Hot Spring property located 15
km west of the northern end Harrison Lake about 95 km northeast of
Vancouver, southwest BC. The property covers a large widespread
zone of gold/silver/base metal mineralization associated with the
highly altered Gambier Group volcanic rocks. The general
environment is similar to the past producing Britannia Mine, a
copper-zinc-gold felsic volcanogenic massive sulphide deposit in
the Gambier volcanics on Howe Sound north of Vancouver. Access
is by logging roads.

Previous operators have completed geophysical surveys, geochemical sampling, grab and trench sampling and diamond drilling. Trench assays by Noranda yielded assays including 0.106 oz.gold/ton and 3.430 oz. silver/ton. Other trench assays returned 0.238 oz.gold/ton, 15 oz. silver/ton and 25% combined lead/zinc.

Mount Hope has examined exploration reports from the Hot Spring property made by several companies since 1944. Exploration has included geophysical surveys, geochemical

mapping and sampling, grab and trench sampling and diamond drilling. The most recent exploration took place between 1988-1990 by Noranda Inc., which included extensive trenching and some diamond drilling.

Mount Hope has completed improvements to the infrastructure of the property; as well as additional geochemistry and geophysics. Diamond drill targets have been identified and a program has been implemented to test the down-dip extension of the thick mineralized zone. A minimum of 5,000 feet will be drilled to outline this zone which management believes has potential for a large low-grade bulk minable deposit.

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
