GEOLOGICAL SURVEY REVIEWS - J.W. Morton, P.Geo., president, THUNDERBIRD PROPERTY reports Wildrose Resources Ltd.

has received new information released by the BC Geological Survey concerning the 100% owned Thunderbird property located 20 km northeast of the Village of Hagensborg, east of Bella Coola, central BC coast. At the recent 1998 BC and Yukon Chamber of Mines convention, the BC Geological survey released the results of a field program completed on the area of the Thunderbird Claims in 1997. This work, authored by G.E. Ray, appears in Geological Fieldwork 1997, paper 1998-1. Among other insights, Mr. Ray concluded the Nifty showing, now part of the Thunderbird property, is similar in depositional environment and time to the Eskay Creek gold/silver deposit in northwest BC.

The Thunderbird property is 10 km in length, consists of 138 claim units. The claims are on the western slope of Thunder Mountain in the valley of the Noosgulch River and cover the former, Nifty, Keen, Jamtart and Cutfinger lead-zinc-silver occurrences. A logging road provides access to the southern claim boundary.

At the Nifty showing, the minerals of interest consist of barite, galena and sphalerite with high silver values. The showings occur near the top of a tufaceous rhyolite unit. A stratiform bed of almost massive barite, often exceeding 5 metres in true width, is underlain by a fragmental unit consisting of fragments of rhyolite, barite, galena and sphalerite. Stinger style zones of massive galena-sphalerite mineralization occur under the fragmental unit and on top of several metres of massive pyrite.

Sampling completed in 1980 by a previous operator included the following results from the Main Zone:
