The silica is used as a flux and the returns have been very close of 0.2 ounces of gold which makes it a viable operation. Harold Hemmerick has worked himself to the bone but is at last getting a little return for his efforts. No mining company could do what he has done as no miner would work this hard for a days' pay. ✓

SUSIE MINE--Fairview Camp, Oliver

This small silica, gold, silver property intends to complete a total of 8000 tons shipped to Trail in 1975. Two men are working this mine at present, cleaning down a slope and hauling the ore to surface in one ton cars, up the slope, where it is dumped on surface. It is then picked up by front-end loader and loaded on trucks for shipment to Trail.

Inspection of the mine was satisfactory. A new cable had just been installed on the hoist. Ventilation to workings is by fan (direct) and it is the intention of the operator, H. Hemmerick, to close down operations for several months as Trail has indicated shipments will have met the amount designated and no more shipments will be accepted in 1975. The two miners have applied for an examination for their Miners' Certificate and this examination will be held during my next visit to this area.
