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The Lara Polymetallic Massive Sulphide Deposit, Vancouver Island,
British Columbia

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The Lara Project, owned 65% by Abermin Corporation and 35% by
Laramide Resources Ltd. is located on Southern Vancouver Island,
British Columbia. Mineralization consists of strataform sulphides
rich in gold, silver, zinc, copper and lead hosted by Devonian age
felsic volcanics of the Sicker Group.

Strataform mineralization has been traced along stike for a
distance of one mile and consists of disseminated and massive
sulphides in a gangue of quartz and carbonate. Cross-cutting
"epigenetic" features are common within the stratabound zone
leading to the conclusion that syngenetic mineralization resulted
from episodic pulses of mineralizing fluids.
