AEROMAGNETIC ANOMALY

20 claims were staked over the main part of the anomaly.

Mr. Nick Bird and myself went by helicopter from Prince George to Tudyah Lake on May 10th, where we stayed overnight. The anomalous area was reached about 5.30 a.m. on the 11th.

Mr. Bill Harvie, pilot, volunteered his assistance in cutting the 15,000' of line. Without this assistance the job would have extended on into the next day. Mr. Harvie refused our offer of a day's pay so a bottle of liqueur was given to him as a token of our appreciation.

Sporadic Arvela readings showed no significant anomaly.

No outcrop was found.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

A road extends to within a couple of miles of the claims. When this road is passable, the claims should be examined. Also, if necessary, additional claims should be staked along the tail of the anomaly to the southeast.
