

Notes on the Blue Creek Property Inspection.

Samples from #9 Adit Dump.

DTX 20-2-1. General grab of small pieces of quartz.

As. 0.55% Ag 1.64 g Au 4.76 g.

20-2-2. Mixed quartz veined intrusive plus quartz.

As. 0.6% Ag 0.22 g Au 0.418 g.

20-2-3. Intrusive with 1 cm and less quartz veins

As 0.01% Ag 0.02 g Au 0.174 g.

20-2-4 Massive quartz with trace arsenopyrite

As 0.48% Ag 0.20 g Au 0.484 g.

20-2-5 Mixed quartz rich rock.

As ? 0.33% Ag 0.10 g Au 0.282 g.

The #9 is caved 20 feet in from the Portal - the caving is in loose, sub-outcrop material and is going to be tricky to clear as the back is all loose material, at least 2 sets will need replacing.

The #9 vein apparently is parallel to the Elizabeth. At some point it should be considered running a drive right through the ridge, #9 and Elizabeth are probably not the same vein, other possibly larger veins may exist between the two.

Good values, supposedly unreported in the literature, are supposed to have been taken by Ellich Sr. from the #9 Elizabeth adit, the upper showing in the literature. Apparently several tons were shipped to Trail and returned good cash from this adit in the late '50's.
