



Under terms of our option with Williams Creek, it is intended to initiate a work programme in the Spring of 1974 which will involve an estimated expenditure of some \$52,000.00. Home will provide 50% of this amount and any partner coming into the deal would share the balance of the costs on a pro rata basis. Overall, including the \$2,000 option payment made in November, we are probably looking at a budget in the range of \$60,000.00.

Included in the folder is a B. C. Department of Mines report by Sutherland Brown which is now out of print and since this comes from my personal files I would like to have it returned after you have finished with it.

After you have had a chance to briefly digest the information contained in the reports, I would appreciate a call from you advising whether Dome might consider taking an interest in this venture as we have other companies who have expressed an interest in studying the information.
