Staking (in Titles records but not on Map Place yet)-

- **Thibert CK.** Angel Jade Mines Ltd. (aka J.T. Thomas) acquired 122 units (Angel and GP claims) near Goldpan Creek, east of Dease Lake, in search of bedrock source of placer gold and platinum group elements (PGE). Jim Thomas and Joe Hidber will placer mine on Goldpan, having acquired placer claims worked for many years by Ed Asp.
- Angel Jade staked 20 lode claim-units near Thibert Creek, for PGE and Au. Thomas and Hidber will placer mine this creek too.
- EH claims (40 units) near Boulder City, east of Dease Lake.
- Verdstone staked 70 units on Hudson Bay Mtn, for tungsten and gold associated with the Glacier Gulch moly deposit.
- Verdstone also staked BX claims (32 units) near Snippaker Creek (Minfile 104B 291, 362), a Cu-Au porphyry-skarn target.
- two other staking crews are in the field now, in different areas.

Morrison - Drilling just started?, 9 holes to complete definition of Cu-Au deposit.

Homestake Ridge (Teck Cominco) and Praxis (CSS Exploration Inc) - Drilling anticipated.

Issues:

Kemess: Staff meetings with MOF regarding coordination of inspection duties on the powerline. Updated MELP RD on same. Work conducted by reclamation contractors has been satisfactory. Some discussion on Terms of Reference for the Project Approval Certificate review. B. McBride working on a permit amendment. Northgate released a mineral inventory for Kemess North: 360 million tonnes @ 0.154% Cu and 0.299 g/t Au. Potential Omineca to Stewart Road remains topical.

Pine Valley Coal: Investigation has revealed that there was an air blast associated with the Jan. 17th blast at this mine. Residents of the local communities and businesses interviewed confirmed it was more than they expected. Blasting procedures submitted to MEM. Environmental monitoring and liaison meeting scheduled for Feb. 14, 2001.

FYI:

Mt. Polley: Imperial Metals has acquired 100% ownership of the Mt. Polley Mine from Sumitomo Corporation. This is good news.

Angel Jade: Major work in Manson Creek area - 100,000+ m³ planned for this year. Working with MOF to ensure that tree removal can be done on time and at a reasonable cost. Company indicates that they will hire as many locals as possible (looking at about 8 people).

Western Canadian Coal: Notices of Work that outline exploration projects have been received from Western Canadian Coal for drill programs on its West Brazion and Wolverine properties.

Eighteenth Annual Cordilleran Exploration Round-Up: Indications are that the event was attended by over 2100 delegates. For the first time in years there seemed to be a positive attitude for companies trying to raise investment capital for exploration in B.C. Several property holders in the North Central Region have indicated that they will be more aggressive during 2001 exploring their properties.

Coal: Inquiries continue to come in. Dusting off the coal mine files.

MMS: Richard Booth in PG for a couple of days and his advice was well received. Backlogs are starting to build because of learning pains and time required to enter all the data from the Notices of Work. May have to discuss priority setting and information requirements.
