Permitting

The week of September 12 - 16 we received 3 MX NoW. One MX permit was issued and 3 applications were referred out.

We received a complaint regarding mechanical disturbance mineral exploration without a permit in the Kimberley area. A site investigation will take place when time allows.

A small gravel pit near Rosen Lake was inspected as follow-up to an anonymous complaint regarding a dangerously high face and property-line encroachment. Both complaints proved groundless.

Contacted the owner of the Crawford Bay Gravel Pit regarding additional permit conditions to keep his neighbors happy. New conditions will restrict operating hours to no early than 7:00 am and depth of excavation to no deeper than 1 m above high groundwater level. Two peiziometer wells will be installed to monitor groundwater levels.

Geology

1) Property visit on Wednesday, Kenville Mine near Blewett. Gold Standard Resources Corp. Met with company principles Bob Burton and Bill Percy, and geologist Greg Thomson. Currently trenching. Small diamond-drill program to come. Focus currently is on the Eagle vein, a Au-bearing quartz vein.

2) Minerals South organizing beginning to take up more time.

3) Public/client assists: approximately 10 (6 phone/e-mail, 4 visitors)

Note we are getting some requests for information on the contaminated sites projects which Ag and Lands are coordinating. The environmental contractors who are doing their background and initial assessment work are requesting information on various sites (Alpine Mine, Second Relief, Mt. Tillicum). Some of this information was previously provided in-house to Gregg Stewart's staff.

Health and Safety

Completed the Western Regional Mine rescue competition,

Clean up of the competition site,

Catch up on piled up paper work,

Investigated public concern over open holes at Coal Creek.

Other

Most of the week centered around the Western Regional Mine Rescue competition.
