**Subject:** Northwest Geology to Oct 4, 2002

**Del Norte** - Teuton Resources Corp reports 0.179 oz/ton Au and 18.4 oz/ton Ag across 10 metres from chip sampling of a recently discovered structurally controlled mineral zone, a quartz-base metal cemented breccia vein. The discovery is in an active snow / rock chute about 0.5 km from 104A 161 and mineralization appears to be similar. Drilling (from a safe site) is in progress. Teuton's press release notes the stratigraphic position is similar to Eskay Creek but does not state that it is a vein breccia. Mountain Boy Minerals staked 56 units adjacent to Teuton's Del Norte claims.

#? **Albert Creek** - Drilled one hole to test a magnetic and silver geochem anomaly. Earn Group mudstone, McDame limestone and serpentinite were intersected. No information available yet on mineralization intersected.

#? **Table Mountain Gold Mine** - Cusac announced it has defined 22,000 tonnes at 33.78 g/t Au by 6 drill holes on the east extension of the Bain vein. Vein width averages 1.45 metres. Past production from Bain vein was about 55,000 tonnes at 14 g/t Au. Cusac raised \$525,000 and is continuing to drill. Am trying to determine resource threshold to re-open the mine and mill requirements.

**Praxis** - Drilling by Northgate Exploration and Praxis Goldfields has concluded. Total drilling was 2483 metres in 7 holes.

**SIB** - Heritage Explorations Ltd. has begun a 2-drill, 4000 metre program (within its \$1.1 million program). The company hopes for a major break-through by deep drilling, as there are 112 mainly shallow holes at SIB. Re-logging of drill core has revealed problems of interpretation and consistency in the original logs which, in turn, has weakened Heritage's mineralization model that was based on those logs. Targets for about 2500 metres of the program: McKay zone (3 ddh), Battleship knoll (1 ddh), Lulu zone (1 "hail Mary" ddh to test below the Coulter thrust fault) and Marguerite zone (1-2 ddh). Heritage has negotiated to acquire the 50% interest in the SIB and Megan claims it does (not own from Uniterre Resources by a series of cash payments totalling \$750,000). This is a key step in the Heritage goal to consolidate the Eskay Creek district.

**Nai Kun Wind Development Inc** - Subsidiary of Uniterre Resources is moving into the alternative energy business with a wind farm proposal in Hecate Strait, offshore from Naikoon Park in the Queen Charlotte Islands!!

**Morrison** - NWMDRC meeting initiated by Pacific Booker Minerals (Oct. 1) with Mike Farnsworth (author of report), Paul Stevenson and Chris Sampson. Only broad concepts so premature to initiate process: approximate ore reserves, no proposal for mill size and location, only vague notion on tailings and waste rock sites, spotty baseline environmental work etc.

**Thorn** - First Au Strategies has reduced its financing objective in (faint) hope that it will be still be able to drill the Thorn high sulfidation prospect in the Atlin area. Will fall weather oblige?

**Maroon Mtn** - Examined drill core with geologist Tony L'Orsa in Smithers on Oct. 2. Gold-bearing quartz vein is in a folded Bowser Lake Group sand /silt/ mudstone sequence which includes an interesting submarine slump(?) conglomerate with variably flattened and elongated cobbles up to 10 cm. Cobbles are mainly fine grained sedimentary (chert, limey siltstone) with up to 1/3 intrusive (feldspar phytic) and minor volcanic rock which suggest provenance from underlying Stikine terrane.

**Tide (104B 129)** - Plutonic Captial Corp. optioned property north of Stewart from Rimfire Minerals Corp. Drilling of high gold and silver vein targets, and prospecting continuation of structures is planned for 2003.

**Noranda** - Office visit by Gilles Bouchard (Canadian exploration manager, based in Laval) and Mike Savell (senior geologist, based in Toronto). Introduced to available regional staff. Discussed Kerr property and other exploration and

**Smithers Exploration Group** - Dan Jepson, executive director of BC & Yukon Chamber of Mines addressed 50 people on Nov 28, including mayor/councillors from Smithers, Telkwa, Houston and Dennis MacKay (local MLA). Strong presentation on priorities and strategy, well received. I gave brief description of MEM office staffing changes/issues.

**SIB** - Heritage Explorations announced drill results. Three holes were drilled in Lulu zone with one significant intercept - 19.5 g/t Au, 1603 g/t Ag over 11.7 metres. It is only 5 metres from the Lulu high grade hole drilled in 1990 (ddh 90-30) [preceding is Confidential]. The Lulu zone is hosted by an intra-rhyolite mudstone, distinct from the Contact Mudstone at Eskay Creek.

One hole was drilled in Battleship Knoll, a prominent quartz-sericite-pyrite alteration zone that is part of the 15 km long belt of gossans on the Eskay and SIB properties. The hole encountered 8.24 g/t Au and 16.8 g/t Ag over 1.4 m. The Battleship Knoll alteration zone extends onto a claim gap about 350 m wide ("Lake gap") owned by Barrick Gold Corp. Heritage drilled four holes north of the gap into the North SIB alteration zone but did not intersect mineralization. Immediately further north is the MacKay zone on the Eskay Creek property. Barrick drilled the MacKay zone earlier this year within 25 metres of the claim boundary. (For many years Homestake/Barrick deferred drilling near the SIB boundary while negotiating for the claims) Previous drilling (1989-1990) mainly tested the MacKay mudstone (equivalent to Datum mudstone at Eskay Creek) that separates the Betty Creek andesite (below) from rhyolite (above). The Contact mudstone appears to be largely absent, due to erosion?? These historic SIB holes intersected many 1-30 metre intervals of anomalous gold (0.3-1 g/t). Hole 90-02, drilled by Tymar Resources in the Lake Gap, encountered 41.0 g/t Au and 58.5 g/t Ag over 3.0 metres in a pyrite-galena-arsenopyrite stockwork in the MacKay mudstone.

**Morrison** - Open pit resource estimate (at 0.3% Cu cut off) based on 60 metre spaced drilling (82 holes, 22 824 metres)

- Measured + Indicated 62.1 million tonnes 0.46% Cu, 0.22 g/t Au
- Inferred 8.9 million tonnes 0.52% Cu, 0.21 g/t Au
- Strip ratio 1.15:1

Bell mine production was (almost) identical - 77.2 million tonnes @ 0.47% Cu, 0.21 g/t Au but at a significantly better strip ratio of 0.75:1. Morrison is not closed off on the northern and southern-most drill sections. These areas, and the high grade core (starter pit) will require further drilling.

**Silvertip** - high grade silver-lead-zinc manto deposit purchased by Silver Standard Resources Inc. for \$1.2 million plus shares. Seller is Imperial Metals Corp.

**Del Norte** - Teuton Resources released two more intercepts on its new vein breccia discovery south of Bear Pass near Meziadin. All 3 holes were drilled from a single site set back about 12 metres from outcrop of the zone and at only 10-20 degree different azimuth and dip. Therefore the intercepts are within a few metres of each other. All 3 holes are listed below. Estimated true width is 10 metres.

- DDH-1 3.65 g/t Au 192.3 g/t Ag across 31.1 m
- DDH-2 4.59 g/t Au 178.9 g/t Ag across 32.9 m
- DDH-3 7.64 g/t Au 277.3 g/t Ag across 23.4 m

**Klappan** - Fortune Minerals states it is updating the reserve model, "started marketing products that it expects to produce" and working with independent power producers for thermal power plant, noting the latter is consistent with the new energy policy.

**Placer designation** - assist Warner Grunewald, working on behalf of a client in the Stewart area.

**Yukon Geoscience Forum** - presented Northwest B.C. mining and exploration summary to enthusiastic audience on Nov 17. Conference registration about 230.

**SIB** - Heritage Explorations released results of 7 drill holes from its much-hyped Hexagon zone, an Eskay target derived from silt and rock geochemistry. Sericite-pyrite-quartz alteration and anomalous mercury, silver and arsenic occur in sheared Betty Creek strata between two parallel faults. The zone is 75 to 185 metres wide and traced nearly 4 km but gold is typically less than 1 g/t. Best intercept is 5.11 g/t Au over 2 metres. Silver values are correspondingly modest. More drilling is planned in 2004.

**New Polaris** - Drilling in progress on this mesothermal vein past-producer, located across the Tulsequah River from Tulsequah Chief. About 3 holes are planned.

**Louise Lake** - Assist consultant for a junior company that is considering option of this high-level copper-gold porphyry 30 km west of Smithers. Drilling by Global Mineral and Chemical Ltd. in 1996 (5 holes) and 1998 (3 holes) was not filed for assessment. The core is thought to be stored in Smithers.

**VMS Talk** - Update Ross Sherlock to prepare Roundup talk on VMS prospects in BC. Sherlock is ex-MDRU but currently employed in Nunavut.

**Bradfield-Iskut Road** - Respond to inquiries by consultants (GE Bridges in Victoria and McElhanney in Terrace) doing an economic assessment of this connector road to Alaska. Made previous studies done in 1991 and 1996 available to them.

**Minerals North** - Two planning meetings have been held for Smithers 2004, April 14-16. Committee comprises Robin Curry (Kemess), Jim Davidson (Town of Smithers), Sherri Howard and Brian Burrill (Chamber of Commerce), Edith MacKay (MLA office), Hans Smit and Daryl Hanson (Minerals North Association), Sharon Robertson (Nadina Community Futures), Darlene Glaim (Wetsuwet'en office) and Paul Wojdak (MEM).

Heritage Explorations Ltd.(TSX.V: HXL) ("Heritage") wishes to announce plans for the Summer 2004 exploration program at its Eskay Creek properties, Northern British Columbia.

Airborne Geophysical program

The previously announced (May 11, 2004) airborne geophysical program has been delayed until mid July 2004 due to operational problems and technical delays encountered by the contractor Aeroquest Limited. It is still contemplated that the 2,600 line kilometer airborne Aero TEM II (time domain EM and magnetic) survey will be completed by the end of July 2004. It is expected that a number of targets will be defined by the survey. The resulting targets and new geophysical information will be integrated into the Geoinformatics 3D models and new 3D exploration targets developed that may still be followed up by further prospecting and drilling during the remaining Summer 2004 season. The estimated cost of this airborne program is \$450,000.

Drill Program

Heritage is planning a drill program commencing in early July 2004. This drill program will focus on drill targets that were not completed last year at the Treaty Creek and Bonsai Prospects. The estimated cost for this drill program is \$250,000 and it is expected to total approximately 1,000 meters. The drill contract has been awarded to Aggressive Diamond Drilling of Kelowna, British Columbia and will be operated from the Bell 2 Camp, northern British Columbia.

#### Qualified Person

The 2004 exploration program will be carried out under the supervision of Heritage's Exploration Manager, Mr. Gerry Bidwell. P.Geol. Mr. Bidwell is a qualified person (as defined by National Instrument 43-101) with more than 30 years experience in the mining industry.

#### Heritage Corporate Strategy

The corporate strategy of Heritage is to be one the a premier junior exploration companies in North America and will continue to pursue an exploration strategy with a specific goal of discovering a large ore body in the Eskay Creek Camp.
