Re: WINDFLOWER Gold Project - Prospectus

Comments

1. Good prospectus - well written.
2. I personally visited the property on July 30, 1987.
3. Mineral reserves are probably conservative i.e. much more potential.
4. New mine in an old mining 'camp' - could really increase exploration/development.
5. Have not seen Granges' FAME '87 final report - should be interesting.
6. Geology favourable for good strike lengths, en echelon, and of course to depth. (i.e. major structures).
7. Mineralization includes tetrahedrite and other sulphosalts(?).
8. Must be careful of acid generation - some ore zones (eg. Main Zone) are sulphide-rich.
9. Structure (mainly folding) is complex and thus may have affect on mining (i.e. bad ground) and ore reserves (dilution/increase).
10. Physical constraints imposed by topography and expected high run off during spring freshet, need to be reconciled for location of tailings disposal system.
