FIVE-PROJECT \$800,000 EXPLORATION BUDGET SET FOR 1991

During 1991, Arbor Resources, in association with several related firms, has defined five large tonnage Klondike gold projects, scheduled for drill testing and/or farming out to major and junior mining companies. The programs are under the direction of Richard W. Hughes, president, and Arthur G. Troup, P. Eng, chief geologist and exploration manager. The five projects are: Lone Star, Paradise Hill, El Dorado Creek Upper Bonanza Shear Zone, Frank Short Pit, Mitchell/Sheba. All in the Klondike gold rush area, south of Dawson City, Yukon.

Arbor has two other exploration projects: a buried strataform copper project in northwest Montana; and some preliminary prospecting and exploration on a high grade copper and gold discovery in the McConnell Creek area, north-central B.C. The work in Montana is in the same geological environment as a number of large buried strataform red bed copper deposits either in production or close to a production decision. A program of continued prospecting, geophysical surveys and staking is planned in Montana. In the McConnell Creek area, prospecting has located four veins up to 3 feet wide carrying copper and gold yielding grab sample assays of 39.6% copper, 5.6 oz. silver per ton and 7.7% copper, 0.17 oz. gold/t, in an area of a very large gossan. Additional prospecting, mapping, and surveys are planned during 1991. - CONTINUED ON PAGE TWO -
