The results clearly indicate both the No.11 and No.18 veins are significant gold-bearing structures. Hole No.795, which intersected a section of the No.11 vein 1.2 metres in thickness (3.94 feet), ran 2.26 oz.gold/ton and 1.09 oz. per ton silver, indicating a potential for a mineable lens of ore on this vein near the junction of the old No.1 vein and the No.11 vein. Hole No.797, the last hole in the program, which was drilled about 75 metres from the south end of the

No.18 vein stope, intersected 1.24 metres (4.10 feet) of vein which assayed 0.94 oz.gold/ton and 2.65 oz.silver/ton. This intersection probably indicated either a new orebody or a large extension of the No.18 vein orebody to as yet undetermined depth.

Due to the early onset of winter only a limited amount of trenching was done this year. A short trench on the No.18 vein revealed a section 15 metres long which ran 0.55 oz. gold/ton and 2.83 oz.silver/ton. This trench indicated the probability that the ore from the No.18 vein stope extends to surface.

In two areas (the South Rhyolite and Skiber's zones) soil sampling has indicated significant gold anomalies in favourable geological environments on fracture zones parallel to the vein systems which have already produced over 250,000 oz. of gold from past production. Winter conditions have postponed any drilling or trenching on these zones until 1995.

Prior to the 1994 Blackdome exploration program, an independent study indicated there is an in-mine possible resource of 80,300 tons grading 0.41 oz.gold/ton (14 grams/tonne). It is clear the 1994 exploration program has indicated an additional mineable resource. Further diamond drilling in 1995 will be required to define the extend these preliminary results.
